## False Fire Alarms!



Did you know...when a false alarm goes off at your house (maybe you burnt your toast?!) you can, and should, call your alarm company immediately to cancel the call (if all is ok!) BEFORE they dispatch the Fire Department/RCMP. Each time our fire fighters respond to a false alarm, it not only takes them away from other possible emergencies; it costs a lot of money: 15 guys, trucks, water, reporting, etc! Let's all do our part!

## Boulevards & Backlanes

Under our Property Standards By-Law 3166-16: ...persons owning or occupying property - this includes residential property, businesses and those properties fronting a Highway - shall keep the sidewalk/boulevard in front or flanking the property, and the lane at rear of property, free of litter and ensure grass & weeds are not unsightly, or a nuisance.



## Vehicle, Camper & Trailer Parking Reminders

*We have had many complaints recently & may issue fines under our By-Laws.*



### No Parking Trailers & Campers on Streets

Parking your camper or trailer on the street for longer than 72 hours is not only in contravention of our Traffic Control By-Law No. 3155-16, it is a safety hazard to pedestrian and vehicle traffic. There have been too many recent instances of near-miss accidents involving children and vehicles, due to "blind spots" caused by campers and trailers. **They must be moved.**

The by-law states, in part:

***"No person shall park or leave a recreational trailer, including motor home, fifth wheel, etc on any street for more than 72 hours, unless a special permit has been granted (reviewed & approved on a case by case basis) and attached to the vehicle."***  
***This includes campers parked on streets thru the week between camping weekends!***

### No Parking on Lawns/Grass

Parking on the lawns, and not on an approved driveway, is not only in contravention of our Zoning By-Law (Section 3.19.1), it is potentially damaging to the underground infrastructure running into your home. Should damage occur due to unnecessary weight loads, you are responsible for full cost of the repair of your infrastructure and restoration of your yard.

Under our Traffic Control By-Law No. 3155-16: *“No person shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk in the Town of Neepawa or park or abandon any bicycle in such a manner so as to create a hazard on any sidewalk, boulevard or street in the Town of Neepawa”.*
