## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Today the Province of Manitoba has advised that all presumptive cases of COVID-19 have been lab confirmed for a total of seven lab-confirmed cases. As of today, NO case of either presumptive or confirmed COVID-19 (Coronavirus) has been identified in Neepawa.

The Town of Neepawa continues to be actively involved in communications with the Province and community leaders to ensure the safety of our residents. The public is encouraged to take heed of the recommendations from public health officials who recommend that all international travelers self-isolate and self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days after returning to Canada.

Given the evolving COVID-19 situation, the health system is now implementing elevated precautions to protect the most vulnerable segment of our population. As a result, certain individuals should NOT visit acute care or long-term care facilities. This includes those who have returned from international travel in the last 14 days; those instructed to self-isolate for 14 days; and those who have cold or flu-like symptoms, such as a cough, fever, runny nose, sore throat, weakness or headache.
