Prairie Mountain Health Region (effective August 20, 2020) Restricted level of #RestartMB Pandemic Response System



It is recommended that people begin to adhere to the following restrictions immediately, as starting Monday August 24, they will be **enforceable**:



Masks - mandatory in all public indoor places & at all indoor and outdoor public gatherings



Public gatherings - restricted to 10 people (both indoors & outdoors).



The Town of Neepawa wishes to remind the public of the importance of following all COVID-19 safety protocols, and advises of the following changes related to municipal property and services.

<u>Civic Administration Building – Municipal Office & Neepawa Area Planning District:</u>

- In addition to all other previously stated protocols Masks will now be MANDATORY to enter the building.
- Public is encouraged, as much as reasonably possible to direct inquiries via telephone or email;
 to continue payment using remote options available; and making appointments if required.

Town Parks and Riverbend Campground:

- **Campground** In addition to all other previously stated protocols Masks will be MANDATORY to enter the office and public indoor spaces.
- Parks Use No reservations permitted; use at own risk; follow all Provincial Health Guidelines.

Swimming Pool:

Pool will will be CLOSED FOR THE SEASON effective Sunday, August 23rd at 9:00 pm, one
week earlier than anticipated due to gatherings being limited to 10 persons.
