Lottery License Holders

If your organization took out a Lottery License in 2025 - please be reminded that in accordance with rules of Manitoba Liquor & Lotteries: **Your Financial Statements MUST BE SUBMITTED** by January 30, 2026 and be available in our office for review and verification by MB Liquor & Lotteries staff.

Failure to do so may make your organization ineligible for Licenses in the future.

Did You Know?

You can make payments anytime for both Water and Tax Notices! If you want to apply \$20/week onto your account (or any amount per week or month) - simply send us an etransfer or set up a recurring payment through the bank! Be sure to put your name and what the payment goes towards in the memo.

2024/2025 Overdue Taxes

2025 Property Taxes were due September 29, 2025. If you happened to miss the deadline and have 2024 taxes still owing on your property, you will be receiving a courtesy letter from the Town of Neepawa in the next few weeks as a reminder to pay before Tax Sale Fees are applied to your account. The letter will not state the amount due for 2025 taxes as only the 2024 amount needs to be paid in order for the property to not incur additional tax sale costs.

SNOW GATES – Why are the snow gates not being used?

The use of the gates for a large volume of wet heavy snow can impede snow clearing operations and subjects the equipment to breakage.

Important Reminders

DO NOT PUT SNOW ONTO STREET

All snow from your driveway must remain in your yard, in accordance with By-Law#3134

DO NOT PARK ON EITHER SIDE OF THE DRIVEWAY

This makes it difficult to use the snow gates

If a ridge was left in front of your driveway, please take a minute to review the following snow clearing tips to reduce the amount of snow that will be left when the plow clears your street.

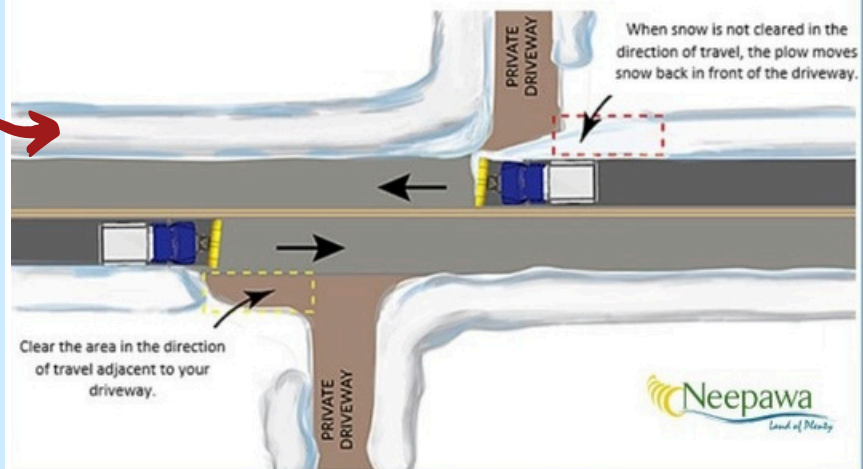
DO NOT PARK ON SNOW ROUTES

These routes are for emergency purposes and must be kept clear for the snow plows to pass. You may be towed.
